



#### **BEST PRACTICES**

- The B.V.J.Science Centre has been established in the College for popularizing the study of Basic Sciences. Under this Science Centre many Science lectures have been organized every fortnight on a regular Basis. In the past five years about 94 lectures and 26 workshops have been organized.
