The Curriculum of the Core and Interdisciplinary courses have been designed not just with the premise of meeting a rewarding career for the students but also to impart value-based education to build the Nation and character of the Individual as well. Implementation of Outcome-Based Education (OBE) and Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) earlier focused on a student-centric teaching and learning methodology. Moving forward, with the implementation of National Educational Policy 2020, all the stipulated guidelines have been mandatorily followed from the Academic year 2021-22. With NEP stressing on no vigorous segmentations through Arts and Science streams, amidst curricular and co-curricular activities, through Vocational and Academic Streams, Open Elective courses have been introduced along with Skill Enhancement Courses, Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses, Value Added Courses encompassing NCC, NSS, Yoga, Scouts and Guides, Digital Fluency, Indian Constitution, etc.

2.2 - Catering to Student Diversity

2.2.1 - The institution assesses students' learning levels and organises special programmes for both slow and advanced learners.

The institution, with extreme care and well established pedagogy strives to identify both the Advanced Learners and the Slow Learners. This is ensured through the academic assessment of each student, primarily judged by the student's performance in the First Internal Test. This test identifies both the Advanced Learners and the Slow Learners. Whilst the academic performance is evaluated by the tests, their overall personalities are judged by the active participation of students in Extension Activities, Classroom Interactions, Group Discussions, Seminar Presentations, Projects, participation in the activities of various Clubs and Committees, not just within the College but external as well. This programme facilitates the process of Mentoring, through which the slow learners are given special attention. Each faculty member of the Department mentors an assigned number of students giving individual, need-based attention on a continuous basis. Additional coaching is given to overcome their learning disability.

- Remedial classes are special need-based classes that cater to the slow learners. Periodic tests are organised to ensure continuous learning.

*Experiential Learning:

The curricula of both the Undergraduate and Post Graduate Programmes ensure a hands-on experiential learning of the students, who are encouraged to visit online sites of the relevant topics and areas. Facilities like E-learning, Online Courses, Field Visits are part of the learning pedagogy to make the learning more experimental, experiential and innovative. Students are given ample support and encouragement to collect, process, manage information through Internet, Textbooks and other published works. Furthermore, different experiential techniques like Project Presentations, Organising Programmes, Presentation in Competitions, Writing and Publishing of Articles and Manuscripts are amply supported.

* Participative Learning:

In UG and PG classes, Presentations are made by the students on a topic assigned to them by the faculty, which is a richly rewarding experience by way of preparation, editing and presentation of learning material and data. Students get ample opportunities to participate either as an individual representing the college or as a Team in the various curricular, co-curricular and extra curricular activities. The college publishes its annual Magazine Srujana wherein the student community participates by way of contributing articles, drawings, essays, poems and various other genres of literature including travelogue, personal memoirs etc

INFRASTRUCTURE AND LEARNING RESOURCES

4.1 - Physical Facilities

4.1.1 - The Institution has adequate infrastructure and physical facilities for teaching-learning, viz., classrooms, laboratories, computing equipments, etc.

The institution, located in the vicinity of R.V. Road Metro Station is well connected by road. With a total land area of 7 acres a built-up area of 111942 sq.ft, it has perfect infrastructure for Academics and Sports.

With a total of 18 departments and 10 Laboratories including 1 research laboratory, the Institution holds 21 Classrooms, 4 classrooms with ICT and 1 Smart Classroom to augment teaching pedagogy. To adhere to 24/7 safety, the corridors are equipped with CCTV cameras and the campus is fitted with 34 CCTV cameras for increased surveillance. There are 185 computing systems and three Copying Machines and 12 Printers. All Science Departments are equipped with laboratories for smooth conducting of Practical sessions.

Furthermore, a Multimedia hall with state-of-the-art ICT facilities and an auditorium Dr. H.N Kalakshetra, with seating capacity of 1000, is used for both conducting Seminars, Conferences and other academic events and to host various other activities that include competitions like Inter-class and Inter-collegiate Drama, Inter-collegiate Music etc.

College Library, which is totally air-conditioned, functions with 61047 books with designated spaces for free browsing facility, question paper bank reference section, reading section and is completely automated for a better reading experience.

ISRO has donated 30 working models to the Museum and a weather monitoring system has been installed. To promote learning of sciences, school kids are invited every year to visit and practically explore the museum. A dedicated space in the third floor hosts science activities.

The Department of Physical Education provides ample opportunities to the students at various sports and have aided them in finding careers in government sector along with Private and Public sectors. With a sprawling 5.5 acres play ground that encompasses football & cricket fields, athletics track, a well-fenced Volleyball court, Cricket practice net and a concrete Basketball court, the institution has been continuously proving it's excellence in various inter, intra-institutional, District, University, State & National Level competitions. A well equipped Gymnasium is used both by students and staff. Coaching Camps are conducted for the students during the Zonal/ Intercollegiate Sports Meets.

The institution hosts a very famed annual Inter College Music Fest, a well organised music competition with renowned judges as juries, providing platform both for singing under various categories and in playing instruments.

The library with a dedicated Librarian and supporting staff is well maintained in tune with the ever changing academic needs. It is fully automated using Libosoft. All books are marked, classified and advantageously placed on the racks for easy identification by the users. The positions of the books are updated with the Libosoft for easy retrieval. All books are periodically inspected to check for possible damages if any and a prompt binding is carried out wherever necessary. The library premises which also houses a washroom for visitors is cleaned on a daily basis and any damage is duly noted and repair carried out.

Overall Campus Maintenance

Painting the buildings, UPS maintenance, Water Purifier, Air Conditioner and Solar Panel maintenances are outsourced for better performance of the equipment. The electrical circuits and equipment are checked regularly by college electricians. Rainwater Re-charging unit has been installed inside the campus. Periodical checks are carried out to maintain proper drainage system. During rainy seasons, to curb the mosquito menace, mosquito repellent

smoke fogging machine is used. A stock register is maintained in every Department and updated periodically.

Sports and Games materials are purchased periodically according to the strength of the students.

The college campus is provided with dust bins at various points that are regularly emptied and cleaned to maintain a clean campus.

The sports equipment, gymnasium, playground and various courts are supervised and maintained by the department of Physical Education.

6.4.3 - Institutional strategies for mobilisation of funds and the optimal utilisation of resources

The National College Jayanagar is a self-financed and Government aided college with management funding as well and is affiliated to the Bangalore University, Jnana Bharathi.

The college obtained autonomy in the year 2005 and comprises both aided courses and unaided courses. The fee collected from the unaided courses cater to the salaries of the staff recruited by the management, infrastructure maintenance, laboratories of the unaided courses etc.

The fee collected for both the aided and the unaided courses are utilized to pay the University Admission Approval fee and Bangalore University Sports fund.

The UGC funding is utilized after a careful scrutiny by the Finance Committee that gets approved by the UGC. This fund is effectively used for the maintenance and procurement of equipment

for the laboratories that cater to the aided courses, conduction of various activities like workshops, seminars, FDP, training courses and for library purposes that comprise purchase of magazines, journals, books etc. and for professional development programs.
